Profile of Milawa & Markwood

The Milawa township of approximately 200 people is located at "The Crossroads", south east of Wangaratta.

Milawa was named in 1874 after being known only as The Square for many years prior. The word "Milawa" is aboriginal in origin and is said to mean "flat land".

Markwood, extending from beautiful Henley Ridge to the lush Oxley Flats, was originally known as "Tea Garden", after the Tea Garden Creek that flows through the area. In more recent times, the area was renamed Markwood, recognising the Marks and Wood families who had settled in the area.

The Milawa - Markwood area is well known as the gourmet food and wine hub in North East Victoria and supports many popular wineries, food venues and events.
